**First Reading: Isaiah 58:1-12 (CEB)**

*Shortly after the return of Israel from exile in Babylon, the people were troubled by the ineffectiveness of their fasts. God reminds them that outward observance is no substitute for genuine fasting that results in acts of justice, such as feeding the hungry, sheltering the homeless, and clothing the naked.*

<sup>1</sup> Shout loudly; don't hold back;  
raise your voice like a trumpet!

Announce to my people their crime,  
to the house of Jacob their sins.

<sup>2</sup> They seek me day after day,  
desiring knowledge of my ways  
like a nation that acted righteously,  
that didn't abandon their God.

They ask me for righteous judgments,  
wanting to be close to God.

<sup>3</sup> "Why do we fast and you don't see;  
why afflict ourselves and you don't notice?"

Yet on your fast day you do whatever you want,  
and oppress all your workers.

<sup>4</sup> You quarrel and brawl, and then you fast;  
you hit each other violently with your fists.

You shouldn't fast as you are doing today  
if you want to make your voice heard on high.

<sup>5</sup> Is this the kind of fast I choose,  
a day of self-affliction,  
of bending one's head like a reed  
and of lying down in mourning clothing and ashes?  
Is this what you call a fast,  
a day acceptable to the Lord?

<sup>6</sup> Isn't this the fast I choose:  
releasing wicked restraints, untying the ropes of a yoke,

setting free the mistreated,  
and breaking every yoke?

<sup>7</sup> Isn't it sharing your bread with the hungry  
and bringing the homeless poor into your house,  
covering the naked when you see them,  
and not hiding from your own family?

<sup>8</sup> Then your light will break out like the dawn,  
and you will be healed quickly.

Your own righteousness will walk before you,  
and the Lord's glory will be your rear guard.

<sup>9</sup> Then you will call, and the Lord will answer;  
you will cry for help, and God will say, "I'm here."

If you remove the yoke from among you,  
the finger-pointing, the wicked speech;

<sup>10</sup> if you open your heart to the hungry,  
and provide abundantly for those who are afflicted,  
your light will shine in the darkness,  
and your gloom will be like the noon.

<sup>11</sup> The Lord will guide you continually  
and provide for you, even in parched places.  
He will rescue your bones.

You will be like a watered garden,  
like a spring of water that won't run dry.

<sup>12</sup> They will rebuild ancient ruins on your account;  
the foundations of generations past you will restore.

You will be called Mender of Broken Walls,  
Restorer of Livable Streets.

### **Psalm: Psalm 112:1-10**

<sup>1</sup> Hallelujah! Happy are they who fear the Lord  
and have great delight in God's commandments!

<sup>2</sup> **Their descendants will be mighty in the land;**  
**the generation of the upright will be blessed.**

<sup>3</sup> Wealth and riches will be in their house,  
and their righteousness will last forever.

<sup>4</sup> **Light shines in the darkness for the upright;**

**the righteous are merciful and full of compassion.**

<sup>5</sup> It is good for them to be generous in lending  
and to manage their affairs with justice.

<sup>6</sup> **For they will never be shaken;**  
**the righteous will be kept in everlasting remembrance.**

<sup>7</sup> They will not be afraid of any evil rumors;  
their heart is steadfast, trusting in the Lord.

<sup>8</sup> **Their heart is established and will not shrink,**  
**until they see their desire upon their enemies.**

<sup>9</sup> They have given freely to the poor, and their righteousness  
stands fast forever;  
they will hold up their head with honor.

<sup>10</sup> **The wicked will see it and be angry; they will gnash their  
teeth and pine away;**  
**the desires of the wicked will perish.**

### **Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 2:1-16 (CEB)**

*Though people such as the Corinthians are enamored with human philosophy and wisdom, Paul continuously presents God's hidden wisdom which is Jesus Christ crucified. True spiritual maturity involves judging ourselves and others in light of God's revelation in the cross.*

<sup>1</sup> When I came to you, brothers and sisters, I didn't come preaching God's secrets to you like I was an expert in speech or wisdom. <sup>2</sup> I had made up my mind not to think about anything while I was with you except Jesus Christ, and to preach him as crucified. <sup>3</sup> I stood in front of you with weakness, fear, and a lot of shaking. <sup>4</sup> My message and my preaching weren't presented with convincing wise words but with a demonstration of the Spirit and of power. <sup>5</sup> I did this so that your faith might not depend on the wisdom of people but on the power of God.

<sup>6</sup> What we say is wisdom to people who are mature. It isn't a wisdom that comes from the present day or from today's leaders who are being reduced to nothing. <sup>7</sup> We talk about God's wisdom, which has been hidden as a secret. God determined this wisdom in advance, before time began, for our glory. <sup>8</sup> It is a wisdom that

none of the present-day rulers have understood, because if they did understand it, they would never have crucified the Lord of glory! <sup>9</sup> But this is precisely what is written: *God has prepared things for those who love him that no eye has seen, or ear has heard, or that haven't crossed the mind of any human being.* <sup>10</sup> God has revealed these things to us through the Spirit. The Spirit searches everything, including the depths of God. <sup>11</sup> Who knows a person's depths except their own spirit that lives in them? In the same way, no one has known the depths of God except God's Spirit. <sup>12</sup> We haven't received the world's spirit but God's Spirit so that we can know the things given to us by God. <sup>13</sup> These are the things we are talking about—not with words taught by human wisdom but with words taught by the Spirit—we are interpreting spiritual things to spiritual people. <sup>14</sup> But people who are unspiritual don't accept the things from God's Spirit. They are foolishness to them and can't be understood, because they can only be comprehended in a spiritual way. <sup>15</sup> Spiritual people comprehend everything, but they themselves aren't understood by anyone. <sup>16</sup> *Who has known the mind of the Lord, who will advise him?* But we have the mind of Christ.

**Gospel: Matthew 5:13-20 (CEB)**

*In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus encourages his followers to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world, doing good works and keeping God's commandments.*

[Jesus said:] <sup>13</sup> “You are the salt of the earth. But if salt loses its saltiness, how will it become salty again? It’s good for nothing except to be thrown away and trampled under people’s feet. <sup>14</sup> You are the light of the world. A city on top of a hill can’t be hidden. <sup>15</sup> Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a basket. Instead, they put it on top of a lampstand, and it shines on all who are in the house. <sup>16</sup> In the same way, let your light shine before people, so they can see the good things you do and praise your Father who is in heaven.

<sup>17</sup> “Don’t even begin to think that I have come to do away with the Law and the Prophets. I haven’t come to do away with them but to fulfill them. <sup>18</sup> I say to you very seriously that as long as heaven and earth exist, neither the smallest letter nor even the smallest stroke of a pen will be erased from the Law until everything there becomes a reality. <sup>19</sup> Therefore, whoever ignores one of the least of these commands and teaches others to do the same will be called the lowest in the kingdom of heaven. But whoever keeps these commands and teaches people to keep them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven. <sup>20</sup> I say to you that unless your righteousness is greater than the righteousness of the legal experts and the Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.

*After:* The Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**



## FAITH FORMATION

**Confirmation: Roots and Relationships** Our students explored the history of the **Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA)**, learning about the 1988 merger of three predecessor bodies. We discussed how our heritage—from the congregational style of the ALC to the hierarchical structure of the LCA—still shapes how we make decisions today. We also looked at how the ELCA works toward unity through "Full Communion" agreements and Social Statements that guide our mission in the world.

**Sunday School: A Miracle in Joppa** This week, our younger learners heard the story of **Peter and Tabitha**. We learned how Tabitha (also known as Dorcas) was famous for her kindness and the beautiful clothes she made for others. When she fell ill and died, Peter prayed for her, and through Jesus' power, she was brought back to life! It was a powerful reminder of how God uses our hands to serve and how Jesus brings hope even in the saddest times.



**Lenten Bible Study: Rebuilding from the Rubble**  
**An Overview of Ezra & Nehemiah**  
**Wednesdays during Lent | Feb 18 – Mar 25**  
**Following the 6:30 PM Lenten Service**

What does it mean to come home after everything has changed? While we are focusing on a few select passages during our Lenten mid-week services, we invite you to stay for a deeper dive into the **complete story** of Ezra and Nehemiah.

These two books are often neglected in the church, but they offer a gritty, honest look at a community attempting to reconstruct its life, its safety, and its faith after a period of intense trauma. In this six-session overview, we will explore:

- **The Bravery of the Unknown:** What it takes to enter uncomfortable new spaces.
- **The Power of the Word:** How a community shifts its foundation from a physical building to the living Word of God.
- **The Crisis of the "Other":** Tough questions about identity, exclusion, and who truly "belongs".
- **Walls and Justice:** Nehemiah's dual mission to provide physical security while demanding economic justice for the poor.

Whether these books are brand new to you or you are looking for a fresh perspective, come and discover how these ancient stories of "rebuilding" speak directly to our lives today.

# LET YOUR LIGHT SHINE!
