SPECIAL MUSIC Sunday School “Love, Love, Love”

First Reading: Exodus 24:12-18 (CEB)

At Mount Sinai, Moses experienced the presence of God for forty days and forty nights. The “glory of the Lord” settled on the mountain, and on the seventh day God called out to Moses. On the mountain God gave Moses the stone tablets inscribed with the ten commandments.

¹² The Lord said to Moses, “Come up to me on the mountain and wait there. I’ll give you the stone tablets with the instructions and the commandments that I’ve written in order to teach them.”

¹³ So Moses and his assistant Joshua got up, and Moses went up God’s mountain. ¹⁴ Moses had said to the elders, “Wait for us here until we come back to you. Aaron and Hur will be here with you. Whoever has a legal dispute may go to them.”

¹⁵ Then Moses went up the mountain, and the cloud covered the mountain. ¹⁶ The Lord’s glorious presence settled on Mount Sinai,

and the cloud covered it for six days. On the seventh day the Lord called to Moses from the cloud. ¹⁷ To the Israelites, the Lord's glorious presence looked like a blazing fire on top of the mountain. ¹⁸ Moses entered the cloud and went up the mountain. Moses stayed on the mountain for forty days and forty nights.

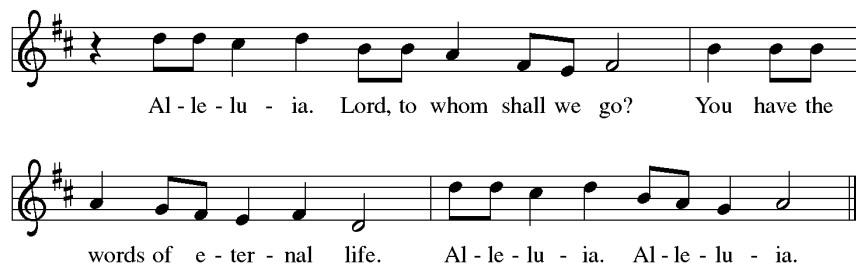

Second Reading: 2 Peter 1:16-21 (CEB)

At the transfiguration, God's voice was heard, declaring Jesus to be the beloved Son. By the activity of the Holy Spirit, God's voice continues to be heard through the word of scripture.

¹⁶We didn't repeat crafty myths when we told you about the powerful coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. Quite the contrary, we witnessed his majesty with our own eyes. ¹⁷He received honor and glory from God the Father when a voice came to him from the magnificent glory, saying, "This is my dearly loved Son, with whom I am well-pleased." ¹⁸We ourselves heard this voice from heaven while we were with him on the holy mountain. ¹⁹In addition, we have a most reliable prophetic word, and you would do well to pay attention to it, just as you would to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. ²⁰Most important, you must know that no prophecy of scripture represents the prophet's own understanding of things, ²¹because no prophecy ever came by human will. Instead, men and women led by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION



Before: The holy Gospel according to Matthew. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

Gospel: Matthew 17:1-9 (CEB)

Shortly before he enters Jerusalem, where he will be crucified, Jesus is revealed to Peter, James, and John in a mountaintop experience of divine glory called the transfiguration.

¹ Six days later Jesus took Peter, James, and John his brother, and brought them to the top of a very high mountain. ² He was

transformed in front of them. His face shone like the sun, and his clothes became as white as light.

³ Moses and Elijah appeared to them, talking with Jesus. ⁴ Peter reacted to all of this by saying to Jesus, “Lord, it’s good that we’re here. If you want, I’ll make three shrines: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.”

⁵ While he was still speaking, look, a bright cloud overshadowed them. A voice from the cloud said, “This is my Son whom I dearly love. I am very pleased with him. Listen to him!” ⁶ Hearing this, the disciples fell on their faces, filled with awe.

⁷ But Jesus came and touched them. “Get up,” he said. “Don’t be afraid.” ⁸ When they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus.

⁹ As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus commanded them, “Don’t tell anybody about the vision until the Human One is raised from the dead.”

After: The Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

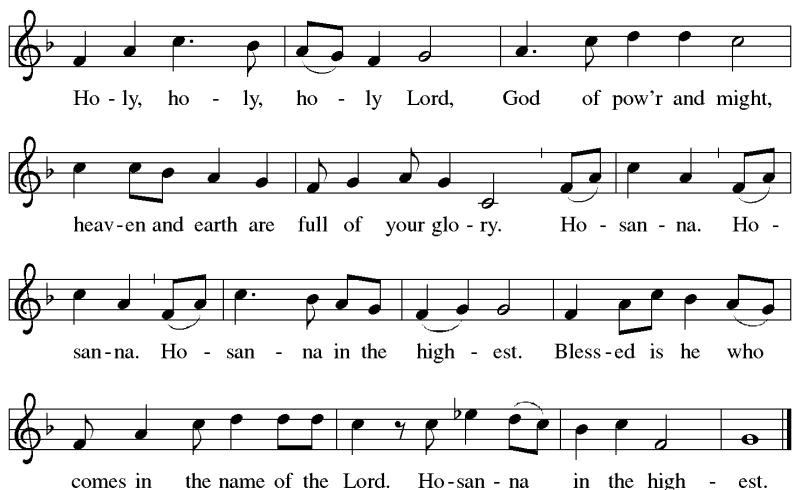

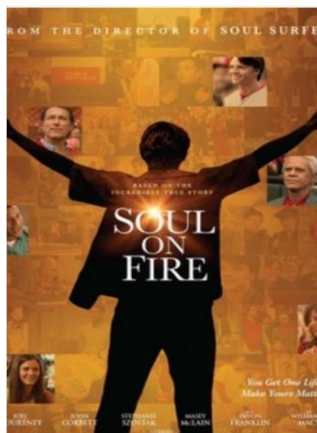

The History of the Ashes

The tradition of placing ashes on the forehead in the shape of a cross is a practice that dates back to the early Church. Historically, ashes have been a powerful biblical symbol of mourning and humility. In the Middle Ages, the practice became a formal part of the liturgy, using ashes made from the burned palm branches of the previous year’s Palm Sunday.

When we receive the ashes, we are reminded of our shared humanity with the words, *"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."* It is a profound moment of honesty that prepares our hearts for the transformation of Easter.

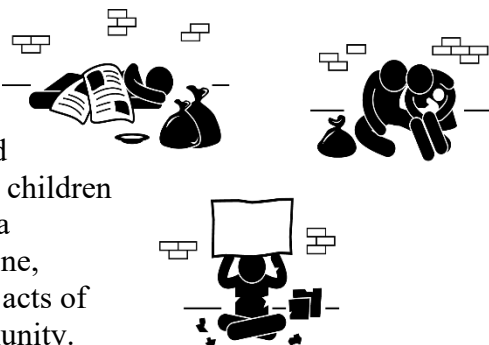
An Invitation to Lenten Disciplines

Lent is more than just "giving something up;" it is an invitation to intentional spiritual growth. We encourage you to consider a discipline that helps you clear away distractions and focus on your relationship with God and your neighbors.

If you are looking for a way to engage this season, consider one of these practices:

Fast with Purpose: Instead of traditional food fast, consider a "digital fast" by reducing screen time or social media use to create more space for silence and prayer.

- **Enrich Your Table:** Try incorporating mindful cooking or exploring new, simple recipes that allow you to focus on gratitude for the nourishment we receive.
- **Study and Reflection:** Commit to reading a specific book of the Bible or a daily Lenten devotional to ground your mornings in scripture. Consider join us after Wednesday services during Lent as we study Ezra and Nehemiah.
- **Intentional Acts of Service:** Dedicate time each week to helping the poor and widows, visiting the sick or in prison, feeding the hungry at a homeless shelter, supplying new and unworn clothing to school children living in poverty, sharing a hospitable smile to everyone, and/or simple anonymous acts of kindness within the community.



Let us be intentional to walk this path together.
